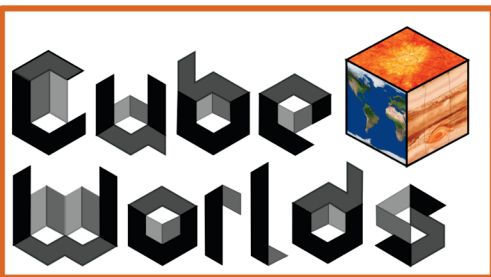
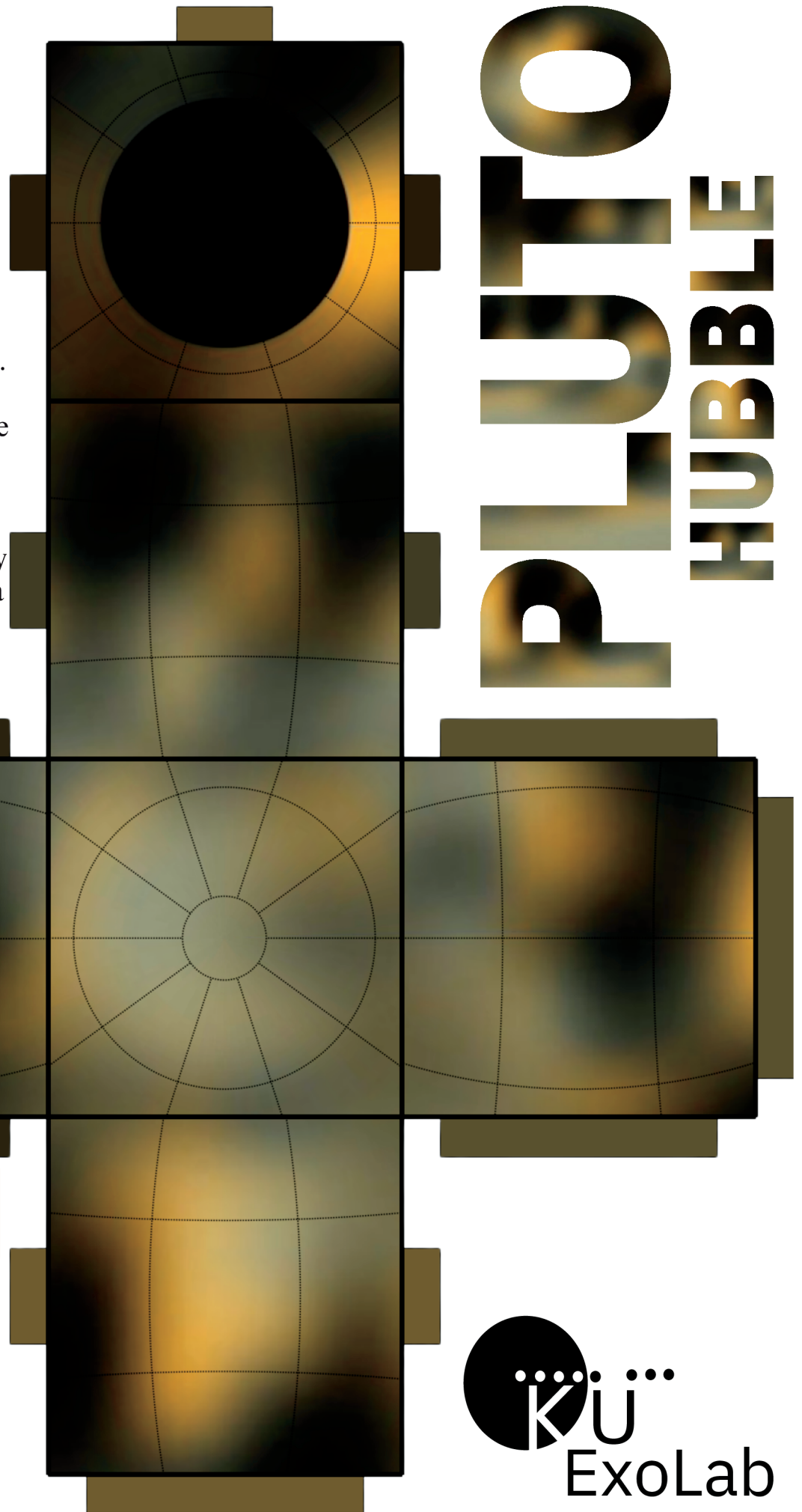


A Blurry Body:

Pluto is a small, icy world located in the outer reaches of our solar system. Since Pluto's discovery in 1930, the dwarf planet has appeared as a tiny speck light to even the largest ground-based telescopes until it was viewed through the Hubble Space Telescope. Here, we show Hubble's view of Pluto's entire surface constructed from multiple photographs taken from 2002-2003. Hubble's view isn't sharp enough to see any craters or mountains--only a splotchy surface with white, dark-orange, and charcoal-black terrain.
